Proposal to the Rector of the University of Eastern Finland on the management of the post of Professor of Radiology on a fixed-term basis: Hearing of the Faculty Council

According to the UEF University Regulations, the Dean shall make proposals to the Rector on the persons to be appointed to professorships with a term of two years or over, to permanent teaching and research positions compliant with the four-stage research career model; and to Tenure Track positions after hearing the Faculty Council.

The filling of the post of Professor of Radiology is about to begin at the Institute of Clinical Medicine of the School of Medicine. Education in the field must be secured also during the filling process, for which reason the Institute proposes that MD Juhana Hakumäki will continue in the post of Professor of Radiology for a fixed term of 1 September 2023 – 31 August 2024. The post is filled for a fixed term due to the management of a vacant post.

As regards the post of Professor of Radiology, the two-year time limit will be exceeded due to the previous management of the post and the followup proposal.

Juhana Hakumäki was found to be eligible for the post of Professor of Radiology in an open call for applications in 2021. The expert statements

## Granting the title of docent in clinical parodontology to DDSc Tuomas Saxlin

DDSc Tuomas Saxlin has proposed that he be awarded the title of docent in Clinical Periodontology at the Faculty of Health Sciences of the University of Eastern Finland. The applicant's CV and list of publications are enclosed with the agenda item as appendices.

The Docent Committee of the Faculty of Health Sciences stated at its meeting that the docentship is purposeful from the perspective of teaching and research activities. The general national educational background requirements and field-specific curricula for specialist education in medicine and dentistry, specialisation training in general practice and additional training programmes for specialists from 1 August 2023

According to section 9(4), subsection 4 of the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland, the Faculty Council will make decisions concerning curricula, degree requirements and student admission criteria. Nationally uniform study guides and examination requirements for specialist education in medicine and dentistry that comply with Decree 55/2020 of the Ministry of Social Affairs and Health were first prepared in spring 2020. Study guides will be compiled every 3 years. Separate Skills Assessment guides will be valid for one academic year at a time.

The general educational background requirements, field-specific curricula and examination requirements for specialist education in medicine and dentistry were prepared in the spring 2023 in national cooperation by the five Finnish universities that provide medical training. General educational background requirements and curricula have been compiled into national study guides for specialist education in medicine and dentistry.

- National study guide for specialist education in medicine (valid from 1
   August 2023 onwards until further notice): Appendix 1
- National skills assessment guide for specialist education in medicine
   (valid from 1 August 2023 to 31 July 2024): Appendix 2



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- National study guide for specialist education in dentistry (valid from 1
   August 2023 until further notice): Appendix 3
- National skills assessment guide for specialist education in dentistry
   (valid from 1 August 2023 until 31 July 2024): Appendix 4
- National field-specific examination requirements for specialist education in medicine and dentistry (valid from 1 August 2023 onwards until further notice): Appendix 5

The general educational background requirements apply to all specialist fields and to all specialising students regardless of the date their study right was granted. The curricula will apply to all specialising students who receive their study right after 1 August 2023. The skills assessment guides will apply to specialising students who receive their study right between 1 August 2023 and 31 July 2024. Specialising students will always have the right, upon application, to shift to following the latest curriculum and Skills Assessment guide.

The general educational background requirements (YEK study guide) for specialist education in general practice were prepared in national cooperation with the study administration and the specialist field of general practice.

The study guide for additional training programmes for medical specialists was updated in spring 2021. This spring, a number of changes were made to the study guide for the additional training programmes, which are



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marked in the guide in red and listed in the change log at the beginning of the guide.

All the aforementioned study guides and examination requirements were discussed by the National Advisory Committee on Professional Further Education and Training (VAJT) on 8 May 2023 and the local committees and regional advisory boards of all universities. The study guides and examination requirements were discussed at the meeting of the UEF Committee on Professional Further Education (AJT) on 17 May 2023 and at the meeting of the Regional Advisory Board on 1 June 2023. The committees decided to submit them to the board for approval as listed in Appendices 1 to 7.

Admission criteria for and the student intake to specialist education in medicine and dentistry for the academic year 2023–2024

In accordance with section 36§ (558/2009) of the Universities Act, the university shall decide on the principles of student admissions. According to section 9.4 of the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland, the Faculty Council will make decisions concerning curricula, degree requirements and student admission criteria. Decree 56/2015 of the Ministry of Social Affairs and Health (amended with Decree 55/2020 and Decree 1240/2022) specify the requirements for being accepted to further professional education and training and the selection criteria. As regards professional postgraduate studies, the nationally agreed upon common admission criteria will be followed.

The faculties that provide professional further education in medicine and dentistry in Finland have prepared admission criteria for specialist education in medicine and dentistry in the spring of 2023. (The current application and admission process has been in use in specialist education in medicine and dentistry since 1 January 2019.) Appendix 1 includes a proposal to the faculty council on the admission criteria for the academic year 2023–2024. The main changes compared to the previous admission criteria are:

Further clarifications on the work experience scores and related instructions



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- Health centre work is only taken into account in Category 1 (excluding general practice).
- Work experience is only taken into account in the field of medicine that
  is being applied for: In the case of persons applying for EL education,
  work experience as a physician and in the case of persons applying for
  EHL, work experience as a dentist will be taken into account.
- Work experience in the EU/EEA is taken into account in the admission points.
- Scoring of specialist education in dentistry
  - Work experience will be taken into account in EHL admission points from the moment the two-year clinical work experience requirement was fulfilled (eligibility for application).
- Improving the admission procedure
  - A scoring form with justifications will be sent with the rejection
     letter to applicants who are rejected in the interview.
  - In addition, technical corrections/specifications can be made and the text edited, e.g., in order to take account of accessibility requirements.

Appendix 2 includes a proposal for the student intake of each specialist field at the University of Eastern Finland for the academic year 2023–2024. The proposal on the student intake is based on a national assessment of the need for training and the number of study places made by the expert group appointed by the Ministry of Social Affairs and Health, as well as on the assessments of the need for local education made by persons in charge of the specialist fields.



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The admission criteria and proposed student intake were discussed by the VAJT on 8 May 2023 and the local committees and regional advisory boards of all universities. The Professional Further Education Committee of the University of Eastern Finland (AJT) discussed the admission criteria and the student intake on 17 May 2023 and the Regional Advisory Board on 1 June 2023 at their meetings and decided to submit them to the faculty council for approval in accordance with Appendices 1 and 2.

# Establishment of an additional training programme in coronary artery surgery at the University of Eastern Finland

According to section 9(4), subsection 4 of the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland, the Faculty Council will make decisions concerning curricula, degree requirements and student admission criteria. According to the national study guide on additional training programmes for specialists in medicine, the purpose of the additional training programmes is to secure expertise in specialist fields based on the needs of the health care system. In some specialist fields, the needs only apply to university hospitals, whilst in others, the specialist expertise is also needed outside university hospitals. Additional training is training provided based on the resources of the health services system (the employer).

An additional training programme in coronary artery surgery has been proposed to be established at all universities that provide medical training. The curriculum for the additional training programme has been prepared in cooperation with the Finnish Cardiac Society (FCS) and nationally by professors of cardiology. The additional training programme in coronary artery surgery is aimed at specialists in cardiology.

A proposal to establish the additional training programme is enclosed with this agenda item as Appendix 1 and the curriculum as Appendix 2.



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The proposal was discussed by the Committee of Professional Medical Further Training at its meeting on 17 May 2023 and by the Regional Advisory Board at its meeting on 1 June 2023. Both bodies support the proposal and propose that it be approved by the Faculty Council.

- 1. The Faculty Council will approve the establishment of an additional training programme in coronary artery surgery, will confirm the required educational background and the content of the training as proposed.

§ 17

Granting a field-specific exemption for psychiatry regarding specialist education in medicine in accordance with Decree 55/2020

The structure of the specialist education in medicine and dentistry is defined in Decree 56/2015 of the Ministry of Social Affairs and Health (amended with Decree 55/2020 and Decree 1240/2022). Based on amendment 55/2020, the length of training in non-university hospitals must be at least one year in addition to the nine-month period at a health care centre. At university hospitals, the length of training must be at least one year, except for training programmes in exercise medicine, health care, occupational health care and general practice. Training arrangements must be provided in a regionally appropriate manner, taking into account the objectives of specialist education and the skills needs of and the training opportunities provided by the service system. When defining the regional field-specific conditions for the completion of the training, the university must request a statement from the regional advisory board on the matter. The statement of the regional advisory board steers the university's activities in the organisation of specialist education. The faculty council will grant the right to deviate from the Decree after consulting the regional advisory board.

The specialist field of Psychiatry has applied for an exemption. The applied right to deviate from Decree 55/2020 concerns students who conduct their specialisation training, principally, at the Central Hospital of Central





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Finland. The exemption concerns a waiver of the requirement to complete a 1-year period at a university hospital (0 months). The exemption would be applied for a fixed period until 31 December 2026. The Central Hospital of Central Finland has a valid exemption from the requirement to work at a University Hospital (6 months), which will expire on 31 August 2023.

The Professional Further Education Committee (AJT) discussed the proposal at its meeting on 17 May 2023 and the Regional Advisory Board supported the exemption as set out in the proposal at its meeting on 1 June 2023.

A regional exemption will be granted to the specialist field of psychiatry so that the requirement to train at a university hospital will be waived as regards persons completing their specialisation studies, principally, at the Central Hospital of Central Finland for a fixed period until 31 December 2026.

The Dean's proposal to the Rector of the University of Eastern Finland on the appointment of PhD Kadri Suija to the post of Associate Professor, general practice (Tenure Track):

Hearing of the Faculty Council

According to section 10(9) of the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland, the Dean shall make proposals to the Rector on the persons to be appointed to professorships with a term of two years or over, to permanent teaching and research positions compliant with the four-stage research career model, and to Tenure Track positions after hearing the Faculty Council.

An open call for applications was organised for the post of Professor/Associate Professor of general practice (Tenure Track) in accordance with the faculty's human resources plan. The post is hosted by the Institute of Public Health and Clinical Nutrition, the School of Medicine. Three applicants applied for the post by the deadline: MD, medical specialist Maria Hägnas, PhD, medical specialist Kadri Suija and MD, medical specialist Silja Kosola, who withdrew her application during the application process. A summary of the applicants is enclosed with this agenda item as an Appendix.

A person to be appointed as an Associate Professor in the Tenure Track shall hold a suitable doctoral degree and have good teaching skills. Furthermore, a person to be appointed as an Associate Professor in the



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Tenure Track shall have the prerequisites for fulfilling the qualification requirements of a Professor by the end of the Tenure Track term (UEF University Regulations, section 31).

Expert statements on the eligibility and merits of those applying for the post have been requested from the following persons, in accordance with the Dean's decision: Professor Johan Eriksson (University of Helsinki, National University of Singapore) and Professor Mette Brekke (University of Oslo).

On the basis of the application documents, expert statements and an interview, the Appointments Committee proposes that PhD Kadri Suija be appointed to the post of Associate Professor of general practice (Tenure Track) for a four-year term from 1 September 2023 onwards (or as agreed). She is the most merited of the applicants to the currently open post and meets the qualification requirements set for it.

No trial lecture will be required.

The proposal of the Admissions Committee, expert statements and the application documents of the person proposed to be appointed to the position are enclosed with this agenda item as appendices.

The criteria, objectives and results to be achieved during the term in order to proceed to the next level of the Tenure Track will be agreed in detail with the appointee to the Associate Professor position when signing the contract of employment.

Description of the part-time post of Professor, Environmental Epidemiology and Risk Assessment, and the Dean's proposal to invite PhD, Docent Timo Lanki to the position: Hearing of the Faculty Council

The faculty's human resources plan includes the filling of a part-time professorship (50%) in environmental epidemiology and risk assessment via the invitation procedure. The professorship is a joint part-time professorship of the Faculty of Science, Forestry and Technology and the Faculty of Health Sciences. The professorship is hosted by the Department of Environmental and Biological Sciences of the Faculty of Science, Forestry and Technology on the Kuopio Campus. At the Faculty of Health Sciences, the professorship is hosted by the Institute of Public Health and Clinical Nutrition, the School of Medicine. At the Faculty of Science, Forestry and Technology, the part-time percentage is 30% and at the Faculty of Health Sciences, 20%. The joint professorship is based on a cooperation agreement signed between the University of Eastern Finland and the National Institute for Health and Welfare.

It is proposed that PhD, Docent Timo Lanki be invited to the part-time (50%) professorship in environmental epidemiology and risk assessment from 1 October 2023 onwards for a fixed five-year term. The professorship is filled for a fixed term due to it being a joint professorship of UEF and the National Institute for Health and Welfare. The post becomes full-time



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through a part-time position (50%) at the National Institute for Health and Welfare.

Timo Lanki's CV and list of publications are enclosed with the agenda item as Appendices.

According to section 33 of the Universities Act (558/2009), the professorship may be filled by invitation without a public notice of vacancy when an academically distinguished person is being invited to take the position or a candidate is appointed to the position for a fixed period. Only a person who indisputably fulfils the qualification requirements may be appointed to the post by invitation.

According to section 31 of the UEF University Regulations, a person to be appointed to a permanent professorship or to a professorship of over a two-year term shall be scientifically or artistically qualified, have good teaching skills and, if important for attending to the duties, practical familiarity with the field of the post.

According to section 10 of the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland, the Dean will decide on the scope and specifications of the professor's position after consulting the Faculty Council. The Dean will decide whether the professor is required to have practical knowledge of the scope of the post.

The Dean will make a proposal to the Rector on a person to be appointed as a professor for two years or more after consulting the Faculty Council.





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The description of the post of Professor, Environmental Epidemiology and Risk Assessment, includes the scope and specifications of the post, as required by the University Regulations, and a proposal on a person to be invited to the post.

The person invited to the post is not required to have practical familiarity with the field of the post.

A draft description of the post is enclosed with this agenda item as an appendix.

The person proposed to be invited to the post has accepted the description and specifications of the post.
