The Dean's proposal on the appointment of Senior Researcher Kristiina Huttunen to the Tenure Track position of Associate Professor (Medicinal Chemistry). Hearing of the Faculty Council

The strategic human resources plan 2023–2025 of the School of Pharmacy includes the post of Associate Professor (Medicinal Chemistry).

The post is hosted by the School of Pharmacy. It has been proposed that Senior Researcher Kristiina Huttunen be appointed to the post without a public call.

The basic composition of the faculty's Tenure Track Committee was supplemented by inviting a representative of the management of the school to participate in it. The Dean of the faculty has invited Professor Jari Yli-Kauhaluoma (University of Helsinki) and Professor Manfred Jung (Albert-Ludwigs Universität) to provide their expert statements on the scientific qualification of Professor Kristiina Huttunen for the post of Associate Professor. In their joint statement, the experts find Senior Researcher Kristiina Huttunen to be competent for the Associate Professor level of the tenure track.

A person to be appointed as an associate professor in the tenure track shall hold a suitable doctoral degree and have good teaching skills. Furthermore, a person to be appointed as an associate professor in the





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tenure track shall have the prerequisites for fulfilling the qualification requirements of a professor by the end of the tenure track term. A person to be appointed as a Senior Researcher shall hold a suitable doctoral degree and have good teaching skills.

As a summary of its assessment, the Appointments Committee states that Senior Researcher Kristiina Huttunen meets the criteria set for the Associate Professor level of the tenure track and the set qualification requirement, and can be proposed to the post of Associate Professor (Tenure Track) in medicinal chemistry.

A memorandum of the committee, statements, and Kristiina Huttunen's CV and list of publications are enclosed with this agenda item as appendices.

According to the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland, the Faculty Council will discuss proposals regarding the scope and specifications of posts that comply with the four-stage career model of the faculty's permanent teaching and research staff and Tenure Track positions. According to the UEF University Regulations, the Dean shall make a proposal to the Rector on the person to be appointed to a Tenure Track position after hearing the Faculty Council.

The Dean of the Faculty proposes to the Rector that Senior Researcher Kristiina Huttunen be appointed to the Tenure Track position of an





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Associate Professor for a period of four years from 1 December 2023 onwards.

According to the university's Tenure Track guidelines, the criteria for the progress on the tenure track will be specified in more detail in the specifying agreement to be annexed to the employment contract.

Granting the title of docent in cardiovascular genetics to PhD Redouane Aherrahrou

PhD Redouane Aherrahrou has proposed that he be awarded the title of docent in cardiovascular genetics at the Faculty of Health Sciences of the University of Eastern Finland. The applicant's CV and list of publications are enclosed with the agenda item as appendices.

The Docent Committee of the Faculty of Health Sciences stated at its meeting that the docentship is purposeful from the perspective of teaching and research activities. The Dean of the Faculty of Health Sciences has invited Professor Terho Lehtimäki (University of Tampere) and Professor Johannes Kettunen (University of Oulu) as experts.

Professor Lehtimäki submitted his statement on 18 August 2023 and Professor Kettunen on 23 August 2023. Both experts consider the applicant to be scientifically qualified for the docentship they are applying for and are in favour of awarding the title of docent. The statements of the experts are enclosed with this agenda item as appendices.

In accordance with section 89 of the Universities Act (558/2009), the university may award the title of docent upon application to a person who has comprehensive knowledge of his or her own field, a capacity for independent research or artistic work demonstrated through publications or some other manner, and good teaching skills.



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The Docent Committee of the Faculty of Health Sciences stated, when it processed the application, that the applicant meets the criteria of the Faculty of Health Sciences as regards teaching skills.

According to section 9(8) of the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland, the Faculty Council shall decide on awarding the title of docent.

The applicant meets the qualification requirements of a docent specified in section 89 of the University Act and the criteria set out in the docentship guidelines of the Faculty of Health Sciences for the title of docent.

Approval of the field-specific equal points criteria related to the scoring scales of certificate-based admissions starting from student admissions 2026

According to section 9 of the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland, the Faculty Council shall make decisions concerning curricula, degree requirements and student admission criteria.

The Faculty Council has approved the scoring scales for certificate-based admissions starting from student admissions 2026 at its meeting of 29 August 2023. The scoring scales adopted did not include field-specific equal points criteria that have been prepared in joint admissions. These joint admissions include Biomedicine, Medical fields (Dentistry and Medicine), Logopedics, Psychology and Law. In addition, field-specific equal points criteria have been prepared for the certificate-based admissions to the degree programme in nutrition at the University of Eastern Finland. The equal points criteria of each of the aforementioned fields are addressed by the faculty council of the faculty that is responsible for the said field of study.

The Appendix specifies the field-specific proposals on equal points criteria for certificate-based admissions in Biomedicine, Medical fields and Nutrition (Table K) starting in 2026.
