The Dean's proposal to the Academic Rector on the person to be appointed as Clinical Lecturer, Psychiatry: Hearing of the Faculty Council

According to the UEF University Regulations, the Dean shall make proposals to the Rector on the persons to be appointed to professorships with a term of two years or over, to permanent teaching and research positions compliant with the four-stage research career model and to Tenure Track positions after hearing the Faculty Council.

A call for applications was organised for the post of Clinical Lecturer (psychiatry) that will be effective until further notice by the Institute of Clinical Medicine of the University of Eastern Finland's School of Medicine.

One applicant submitted their application to the post by the deadline: Mikko Joensuu.

A person to be appointed as Clinical Lecturer shall hold a suitable doctoral degree. For a special reason, a person who has completed a specialist degree in medicine or dentistry or a person who has the right to act as a specialist in medicine or dentistry may be appointed as Clinical Lecturer. Furthermore, a person to be appointed as Clinical Lecturer shall have good teaching skills (section 31 of the UEF University Regulations).



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Members of the university's teaching and research staff are required to have command of the language they give teaching in (Finnish or Swedish) (Government Decree on Universities 770/2009). The Dean of the faculty can grant an exemption from the language proficiency requirements laid down in the Government Decree on Universities (UEF University Regulations, section 33).

The Institute of Clinical Medicine proposes in its proposal (Appendix) that MD, medical specialist Mikko Joensuu be appointed to the said post of Clinical Lecturer from 1 August 2024 until further notice. The Head of the School of Medicine supports the proposal.

§ 18

Approving the admission criteria and curriculum for the training preparing dentists who have completed their degree outside the EU/EEA for competency examinations (PÄTE training)

According to section 9 of the UEF University Regulations, the Faculty Council shall make decisions concerning student admission criteria and curricula.

To be able to work as dentists in Finland, persons who have completed their dentist education outside the EU/EEA, must have been granted the right to practise the profession in Finland by Valvira. The University of Turku and the University of Eastern Finland provide preparatory training for the qualification process. The University of Helsinki will implement the selection process related to the training.

Education does not lead to a degree. Four (4) places have been proposed for the training implemented at the University of Eastern Finland. The duration of the training is 4.5 months (08/2024–12/2024) and it includes on-campus and remote teaching provided in Finnish.

Students admitted to the training are granted a separate right to study at the Faculty of Health Sciences in the University of Eastern Finland. The separate right to study is granted for a fixed term (according to the duration of the training). The right to study enables participation in





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Bachelor's and Master's degree level courses in dentistry, in accordance with the participants' personal study plan. The curriculum for the Bachelor's and Master's degree programmes in dentistry are confirmed annually by the Faculty Council. The separate right to study only applies to this education and to the courses included in it.

The Institute of Dentistry of the School of Medicine has prepared a proposal for the admission criteria for the training that prepares dentists who have completed their degree outside the EU/EEA for competency examinations (Appendix 1) and a proposal for a curriculum (Appendix 2).

Motion

The Faculty Council approves the admission criteria for the training that prepares dentists who have completed their degree outside the EU/EEA for competency examinations (PÄTE training) and the curriculum as proposed and authorises the Dean to make technical changes to them.
