§ 6

Granting the title of docent to PhD Daniel McIntyre

PhD Daniel McIntyre has applied for the title of docent in English Language at the University of Eastern Finland. The application for the title of docent was initiated on 08 August 2023 at the Philosophical Faculty of the University of Eastern Finland.

In accordance with section 89 of the Universities Act (558/2009), the university may award the title of docent upon application to a person who has comprehensive knowledge of his or her own field, a capacity for independent research or artistic work demonstrated through publications or some other manner, and good teaching skills.

The School of Humanities has considered the title of docent applied for by PhD Daniel McIntyre to be purposeful for the teaching and research of the School based on the following grounds: "Professor McIntyre's specific fields include stylistics, corpus-based digital linguistics and the history of the English language. Professor McIntyre is a highly experienced and internationally networked researcher with a high-quality list of publications, including several responsible editorial tasks. The docentship will strengthen the international profile of the academic subject and promote networking with the world's leading researchers in the selected strategic fields of language research. In the European context, the academic subject of English of the University of Uppsala is one of the



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leading and most visible units, and the docentship will create a good basis to support this link and, subsequently, will strengthen the position and visibility of the academic subject of the University of Eastern Finland. Whilst Professor McIntyre strengthens the competence within the academic subject that has weakened through, e.g., retirement (e.g., stylistics), this also provides the opportunity to utilise the docentship in supervision and other activities."

The Dean of the Faculty of Philosophy decided (on 10 November 2023) to invite Professor Michael Haugh (University of Queensland, Australia) and Professor Emerita Gabriella Mazzon (Innsbruck University, Austria) as experts to provide statements on the scientific qualifications of PhD Daniel McIntyre for the title of docent in English Language. Haugh and Mazzon, the experts appointed by the Dean, are in favour of awarding the title of docent to McIntyre.

A person to be awarded the title of docent is required to have good teaching skills (Universities Act 558/2009). The Dean may exempt the applicant from the requirement to give a trial lecture if the teaching merits can be verified in some other manner in accordance with the faculty's instructions on awarding the title of docent. By a decision of 4 June 2024, the Dean has exempted McIntyre from the requirement to give a trial lecture and has determined his teaching merits based on the application documents.



According to section 9(8) of the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland, the Faculty Council shall decide on awarding the title of docent.

The applicant meets the qualification requirements of a docent specified in section 89 of the University Act and the criteria set out in the docentship guidelines of the Philosophical Faculty for the title of docent.

- MotionThe Faculty Council states that PhD Daniel McIntyre meets the criteria set
out in the Universities Act for the title of docent and grants him the title of
docent at the University of Eastern Finland in English Language.
