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

§ 6

Granting the title of docent in preclinical functional imaging to PhD Jaakko Paasonen

PhD Jaakko Paasonen has proposed that he be awarded the title of docent in the field of Preclinical functional imaging at the Faculty of Health Sciences of the University of Eastern Finland. The applicant's CV and list of publications are enclosed with the agenda item as appendices.

The Docent Committee of the Faculty of Health Sciences stated at its meeting that the docentship is purposeful from the perspective of teaching and research activities. The Dean of the Faculty of Health Sciences has invited Professor Risto Kauppinen (University of Bristol) and Docent Juha Nikkinen (University Hospital of Oulu) as experts.

Professor Kauppinen submitted his statement on 3 October 2024 and Docent Nikkinen on 13 November 2024. Both experts consider the applicant to be scientifically qualified for the docentship they are applying for and are in favour of awarding the title of docent. The statements of the experts are enclosed with this agenda item as appendices.

In accordance with section 89 of the Universities Act (558/2009), the university may award the title of docent upon application to a person who has comprehensive knowledge of his or her own field, a capacity for independent research or artistic work demonstrated through publications or some other manner, and good teaching skills.



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The Docent Committee of the Faculty of Health Sciences stated, when it processed the application, that the applicant meets the criteria of the Faculty of Health Sciences as regards teaching skills.

According to section 9(8) of the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland, the Faculty Council shall decide on awarding the title of docent.

The applicant meets the qualification requirements of a docent specified in section 89 of the Universities Act and the criteria set out in the docentship guidelines of the Faculty of Health Sciences for the title of docent.

§ 12

Conferring an Honorary Doctorate

The University of Eastern Finland will hold a Doctoral Conferment Ceremony on the Kuopio campus on 5–7 June 2025. According to section 9 of the UEF University Regulations, the Faculty Council shall decide on the conferment of honorary doctorates.

Each faculty participating in the Doctoral Conferment Ceremony may propose 3-6 honorary doctors, from among whom the university's leadership will select the honorary doctors together with the faculties.
