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

Hearing of the Faculty Council

By his decision, the Dean of the Faculty of Health Sciences has approved the description of the post of Professor/Associate Professor of Health Care.

One applicant applied for the post by the deadline: Tuomas Rauramaa.

In accordance with the Universities Act, statements must be requested before the appointment on the qualification and merits of the applicants or the person to be invited to the post from a minimum of two experts when a person is being recruited for an employment relationship that will be effective until further notice or for a fixed period of at least two years. Sections 27–29 of the Administrative Procedure Act (434/2003) on disqualification shall be applied to the experts.

According to the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland, a person to be appointed as Professor shall be scientifically or artistically qualified, have good teaching skills and, if important for attending to the duties, have practical familiarity with the field of the post.

The Dean's proposal to the Rector of the University of Eastern Finland on the appointment of PhD Marko Lehtonen to the Tenure Track position of Associate Professor,

**Pharmaceutical Analytics: Hearing of the Faculty Council** 

According to section 10(9) of the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland, the Dean shall make proposals to the Rector on the persons to be appointed to professorships with a term of two years or over, to permanent teaching and research positions compliant with the four-stage research career model, and to Tenure Track positions after hearing the Faculty Council.

The post of Associate Professor of Pharmaceutical Analytics (Tenure Track) that complies with the faculty's human resources plan is hosted by the School of Pharmacy. An open call for applications was organised for the post and one (1) person submitted an application by the deadline: PhD Marko Lehtonen.

A person to be appointed as an Associate Professor in the Tenure Track shall hold a suitable doctoral degree and have good teaching skills. Furthermore, a person to be appointed as an Associate Professor in the Tenure Track shall have the prerequisites for fulfilling the qualification requirements of a Professor by the end of the Tenure Track term (UEF University Regulations, section 31).



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The Dean of the Faculty has invited Professor Juha-Pekka Salminen (University of Turku) and Risto K. Kostiainen (University of Helsinki) to provide their expert statements on the scientific qualification of Assistant Professor Marko Lehtonen for the post of Associate Professor. In their joint statement, the experts find Marko Lehtonen to be competent for the post in question.

Based on the application documents, expert statements and an interview, the Appointments Committee proposes that MD Marko Lehtonen be appointed to the post of Associate Professor of Pharmaceutical Analytics (Tenure Track) for a four-year term from 1 August 2025 onwards (or as agreed). He is merited to the currently open post and meets the qualification requirements set for it.

No trial lecture will be required.

The proposal of the Admissions Committee, expert statements and the application documents of the person proposed to be appointed to the position are enclosed with this agenda item as appendices.

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According to section 29 of the Universities Act (24.7.2009/558), a study attainment may be assessed only by those members or deputy members of a multi-member administrative body who have a degree or completed study attainments of an equivalent level or who have been appointed professors.

## Motion

Based on the statement, the Faculty Council grades MSc (Pharmacy) Janne Tampio's doctoral dissertation as Pass.

## **Decision**

The Faculty Council decided not to grade the doctoral dissertation and to refer the matter back to processing because the doctoral candidate submitted a response to the opponent's statement after the Faculty Council's agenda was published. The opponent is requested to provide an additional statement regarding their statement/doctoral candidate's response.

# Approval of the admission criteria and curriculum for group psychotherapist training 2026-2029

According to section 9 of the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland, the Faculty Council will make decisions concerning curricula, degree requirements and student admission criteria.

Government Decree 1120/2010 amending the Decree on Health
Professionals entered into force on 31 December 2011. Under section 2a
of the Decree, the use of the protected title of a psychotherapist is subject
to the condition that the person concerned has completed
psychotherapist training organised by a university or by a university
together with another training organisation. The skills required to work as
a psychotherapist are acquired through studies whose scope must be 60
ECTS at the minimum and that consist of theoretical studies, supervised
psychotherapist work with patients, educational psychotherapy and skills
demonstration. Competence is proved through a skills demonstration. The
university issues the student a certificate of the completion of the training.

The psychotherapist training organised by the Faculty of Health Sciences or the Philosophical Faculty of the University of Eastern Finland is professional development training for health professionals that leads to the professional title of a health care psychotherapist in accordance with the Government Decree (VNA 1120/2010). The trainings are managed by



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the Centre for Continuous Learning of the University of Eastern Finland. In professional development training, students do not have the status of a degree student.

The minimum of 8 and the maximum of 12 students (three (3) students on a waiting list) will be admitted to the group psychotherapist training that will start in the spring 2026 in accordance with the enclosed admission criteria. The planned application period is 23 June – 13 October 2025. Selected students are granted a fixed term right to study in the training to which they have been selected.

The Academic Rector appointed a Steering Committee for psychotherapist training on 23 November 2023. The term of the Steering Committee is 4 years (2024–2027). The Steering Committee includes 3 full and deputy members from the Faculty of Health Sciences and 2 full and deputy members from the Philosophical Faculty. In addition, the Steering Committee includes 1 member and deputy member from the Centre for Continuous Learning. The curriculum has been approved by Minna Valkonen-Korhonen who was appointed by the steering committee for psychotherapist training as the person in charge of the education. The person in charge of the education at the university is Minna Valkonen-Korhonen and the main trainer is Taru Kaivola, Trainer Psychotherapist (VET), Suomen ryhmäanalyysikoulutus Oy.

The scope of the group psychotherapist training is 85 ECTS. The duration of the training is four academic years (2026–2029).



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# Motion

The Faculty Council approves the admission criteria and curricula for the group psychotherapist training in accordance with the Annexes and delegates to the Dean the approval of any additions and corrections made to the curricula.

# Approval of amendments to the curriculum for the Master of Science (Pharmacy) degree programme 2025–2028

According to section 9 of the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland, the Faculty Council will make decisions concerning curricula and degree requirements. The Faculty Council also approves any significant changes made to the confirmed curriculum.

The Faculty Council of the Faculty of Health Sciences has approved the curriculum for the Master of Science (Pharmacy) degree programme for the academic years 2025-2028 at its meeting of 20 February 2025 (record entry 6411/03.00.01/2023).

The specialist field of biopharmacy proposes the following amendments to the confirmed curriculum for the Master of Science (Pharmacy) degree programme:

- Changing the scope of Drug Metabolism and Pharmacokinetics
   4215505 (DMPK) from 4 ECTS to 5 ECTS.
  - The change in the scope of the course affects the scope of the compulsory advanced studies in the specialist fields of biopharmacy, pharmacology and drug toxicology of the 4–5-year students of the Master of Science (Pharmacy) degree programme.
     In other specialist fields, the course is available as part of optional advanced studies.



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- 2. Changing the scope of ADME Models and pharmacokinetic modelling TF00CO82 (ADMEL) from 3–4 ECTS to 4–5 ECTS.
  - The change in the scope of the course affects the scope of the compulsory advanced studies in the specialist field of biopharmacy of the 4–5-year students of the Master of Science (Pharmacy) degree programme. In other specialist fields, the course is available as part of optional advanced studies.
- 3. Physical Pharmacy in Formulation Development TF00CO95 (FOFA), 4
  ECTS, will be removed from the compulsory advanced studies in the
  specialist field of biopharmacy of the 4–5-year students of the Master of
  Science (Pharmacy) degree programme. In the future, the course will
  only be available as an optional advanced course.

The proposal of the person in charge of the specialist field of biopharmacy is enclosed with the agenda item as an Annex. An updated version of the degree structure of the Master of Science (Pharmacy) degree programme is also enclosed with the agenda item as an Annex.

National skills assessment guides for specialist education in medicine and dentistry for the period 1 August 2025 – 31 July 2026

According to section 9(4) of the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland, the Faculty Council will make decisions concerning curricula, degree requirements and student admission criteria.

The skills assessment guides for specialist education in medicine and dentistry that comply with Decree 55/2020 of the Ministry of Social Affairs and Health are valid for one academic year at a time and their content is updated annually through national cooperation. The skills assessment guide is included in the curriculum.

The skills assessment guides that are proposed to be accepted concern specialising students who receive their study right between 1 August 2025 and 31 July 2026. Specialising students who received their study right earlier than that will have the opportunity to shift to following the latest skills assessment guide.

The skills assessment guides were discussed by the National Advisory

Committee on Professional Further Education and Training (VAJT) on 05

May 2025 and by the local committees and regional advisory boards of all five universities.

Student intake to specialist education in medicine and dentistry for the academic year 2025–2026

In accordance with section 36§ (558/2009) of the Universities Act, the university shall decide on the principles of student admissions. According to section 9(4) of the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland, the Faculty Council will make decisions concerning curricula, degree requirements and student admission criteria.

On 19 June 2024, the Faculty Council confirmed the admission criteria for specialist education in medicine and dentistry for the academic years 2024–2026. The student intake is based on the needs assessment of student intake carried out at universities by the expert working group appointed by the coordination committee of the Ministry of Social Affairs and Health in specialist education in medicine and dentistry. The student intake to specialist education in medicine and dentistry in autumn 2025 is proposed to the Faculty Council for confirmation as set out in Annex 1. Any study places that are not filled in autumn 2025 will be filled in the additional admissions in spring 2026.

The student intake was discussed by the Professional Further Education Committee on 7 May 2025 and the Regional Advisory Board on 12 May 2025. The committees propose that the student intake be approved by the Faculty Council.

# Election of a deputy member to the Faculty Council

# Awarding the title of docent in toxicology of air pollution to PhD Mo Yang

PhD Mo Yang has proposed that he be awarded the title of docent in the field of toxicology of air pollution at the Faculty of Health Sciences of the University of Eastern Finland. The applicant's CV and list of publications are enclosed with the agenda item as Annexes.

The Docent Committee of the Faculty of Health Sciences stated at its meeting that the docentship is purposeful from the perspective of teaching and research activities. The Dean of the Faculty of Health Sciences has invited Docent Merja Korkalainen (THL) and docent Khaled Abass (University of Oulu) as experts.

Docent Korkalainen submitted her statement on 20 May 2025 and Docent Abass on 3 June 2025. Both experts consider the applicant to be scientifically qualified for the docentship they are applying for and are in favour of awarding the title of docent. The statements of the experts are enclosed with this agenda item as Annexes.

In accordance with section 89 of the Universities Act (558/2009), the university may award the title of docent upon application to a person who has comprehensive knowledge of his or her own field, a capacity for independent research or artistic work demonstrated through publications or some other manner, and good teaching skills.





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The Docent Committee of the Faculty of Health Sciences stated, when it processed the application, that the applicant meets the criteria of the Faculty of Health Sciences as regards teaching skills.

According to section 9(8) of the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland, the Faculty Council shall decide on awarding the title of docent.

The applicant meets the qualification requirements of a docent specified in section 89 of the Universities Act and the criteria set out in the docentship guidelines of the Faculty of Health Sciences for the title of docent.

The Dean's proposal to the Rector of the University of Eastern Finland on the appointment of DDSc Susanna Paju to the post of Associate Professor, Parodontology and Oral Geriatrics (Tenure Track): Hearing of the Faculty Council

According to section 10(9) of the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland, the Dean shall make proposals to the Rector on the persons to be appointed to professorships with a term of two years or over, to permanent teaching and research positions compliant with the four-stage research career model, and to Tenure Track positions after hearing the Faculty Council.

The post of Associate Professor of Parodontology and Oral Geriatrics (Tenure Track) that complies with the faculty's human resources plan is hosted by the Institute of Dentistry at the School of Medicine. An open call for applications was organised for the post and two (2) persons submitted an application by the deadline: DDSc Susanna Paju and DDSc Tuomas Saxlin.

A person to be appointed as an Associate Professor in the Tenure Track shall hold a suitable doctoral degree and have good teaching skills.

Furthermore, a person to be appointed as an Associate Professor in the Tenure Track shall have the prerequisites for fulfilling the qualification



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requirements of a Professor by the end of the Tenure Track term (UEF University Regulations, section 31).

The Dean of the Faculty has invited Marja Laine (Vrije Universiteit Amsterdam), Rodrigo Lopez (University of Bergen) and Andreas Stavropoulos (Malmö University) as experts to provide a statement on the scientific qualification of the applicants to the post. In their joint statement, the experts find both applicants to be qualified for the post in question.

Based on the application documents, expert statements and an interview, the Appointments Committee proposes that DDSc Susanna Paju be appointed to the post of Associate Professor of Parodontology and Oral Geriatrics (Tenure Track) for a four year term from 1 August 2025 onwards (or as agreed). She is the most merited of the applicants to the currently vacant post and meets the qualification requirements set for it.

No trial lecture will be required.

The proposal of the Admissions Committee, expert statements and the application documents of the person proposed to be appointed to the position are enclosed with this agenda item as appendices.

The criteria, objectives and results to be achieved during the term in order to proceed to the next level of the Tenure Track will be agreed in detail with the appointee to the Associate Professor position when signing the contract of employment.
