§ 7

Approving the study guide of the Philosophical Faculty for the academic year 2025–2026

According to section 9 of the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland, the Faculty Council will make decisions concerning curricula and degree requirements. According to section 18 of the Education Regulations, the faculties' curricula shall specify which degrees can be completed in the faculty and in which languages the degrees can be completed. The faculties' curricula shall contain the curricula of the degree programmes and the common regulations for all degree programmes. The curriculum of a degree programme must indicate the following: a plan for the guidance of major and minor subject students and the arrangement of guidance; the regulations concerning studies and degrees, such as the grounds for recognition of prior learning, the expiration of studies, the number of attempts to complete and repeat studies, the organisation of exams, and any transitional provisions.

Since the academic year 2019–2020, the University of Eastern Finland has used an electronic study guide that is available in Kamu (the current study guide). The guide includes matters jointly agreed within the university and, in particular, regulations concerning studies and degrees at the Philosophical Faculty that are decided by the Faculty Council.

Several amendments are being proposed to this study guide. Some of the change needs are related to the new Education Regulations, which took



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effect on 1 January 2024. Its validity provisions (section 47) contain a number of transitional rules concerning curricula. The sections and chapters concerning curricula (sections 18 and 26, and chapter VI) shall apply from 1 August 2025 at the latest. In the Philosophical Faculty, the said sections and chapters are applied to the curricula for Bachelor's and Master's degree education and corresponding studies, which will take effect on 1 August 2025.

The amendments concern, for example, the assessment of study attainments and study modules, examinations, theses and maturity tests, and the duty to attend.

Standing orders have been prepared by the faculty's Development Committee for Education.

The guide and amendments proposed to it can be found in the annexes.

The evaluation matrices of theses and a table describing the language of the maturity test are enclosed as separate files.

Motion

I propose that the Faculty Council of the Philosophical Faculty approves the study guide of the Faculty for the academic year 2025–2026 in accordance with the proposal and delegates to the Vice Dean responsible for education the right to accept, by their decision, any corrections and clarifications to the study guide.

§ 8

Confirming the transitional rules and correlation tables of Bachelor's and Master's degree programmes for the academic years 2025-2028

According to section 9(4) of the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland, the Faculty Council will decide on curricula, among other things. According to section 18 of the Education Regulations, the curriculum of each degree programme must indicate, among others, the degree structure (including the courses and their scope) and the desired learning outcomes, contents, evaluation methods and modes of teaching of the degree and its parts, as well as any transitional provisions.

On 17 December 2024, the Academic Rector provided instructions on transitional rules between the new and the old curriculum. According to the instructions, the transitional procedures are clearly described in the curriculum. In general, the correlation tables between the new and the old curricula should also be described (e.g., correlation between the new and the old courses).

Some of the transitional rules and correlation tables were confirmed by the Faculty Council on 27 February 2025.

Admission of degree students of textile teacher education to multidisciplinary studies completed in 2025 at the University of Jyväskylä as cross-institutional studies in subjects and thematic entities taught in basic education

According to section 9 of the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland, the Faculty Council shall make decisions concerning curricula, degree requirements and student admission criteria.

The University of Eastern Finland and the University of Jyväskylä have concluded a fixed-term agreement on cross-institutional studies entitled "UEF käsityön aineopinnot – JYU luokanopettajakoulutuksen monialaiset opinnot". According to the Agreement, the University of Eastern Finland offers, each academic year, intermediate studies in Craft Science (35 ECTS) to two students of the Bachelor's and Master's degree programme of the Faculty of Education and Psychology of the University of Jyväskylä who have completed basic studies in crafts, and the University of Jyväskylä will offer, each academic year, multidisciplinary studies in subjects and thematic entities taught in basic education to two degree students of textile teacher education at the University of Eastern Finland (60 ECTS). The cross-institutional study agreement will be valid from 1 August 2025 to 31 July 2028.

Each academic year, the subject of Crafts of the School of Applied Educational Science and Teacher Education selects up to two Bachelor's or



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Master's degree students of textile teacher education to complete multidisciplinary studies at the University of Jyväskylä on subjects and thematic entities taught in basic education in accordance with the cross-institutional study agreement. The academic subject has prepared the enclosed admission criteria for the studies starting in the autumn semester 2025. The pedagogical leader of the School of Applied Educational Science and Teacher Education has proposed admission criteria to the Faculty Council for approval.

§ 11

Granting the title of docent to PhD Johanna Turunen

PhD Johanna Turunen has applied for the title of docent in Cultural Studies, in particular Critical Heritage Studies, at the University of Eastern Finland. The application for the title of docent was initiated on 09 October 2024 at the Philosophical Faculty of the University of Eastern Finland.

In accordance with section 89 of the Universities Act (558/2009), the university may award the title of docent upon application to a person who has comprehensive knowledge of his or her own field, a capacity for independent research or artistic work demonstrated through publications or some other manner, and good teaching skills.

The School of Humanities has considered the title of docent applied for by PhD Johanna Turunen to be purposeful for the teaching and research of the School based on the following grounds: "Turunen's expertise complements the competence of the School of Humanities in an area that is closely linked to museology, which has been growing strongly internationally. Critical heritage studies focus on the impact of the past on the present, its impact on identities, but also on the responsibility aspects of preserving cultural heritage. The questions addressed by critical heritage studies are key to the research conducted in the School of Humanities, but there is currently no researcher who would focus on these questions within the School. Furthermore, museology, which is



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closely linked to critical heritage studies, is not currently taught in the School. Turunen's docentship would complement, in an important manner, the degree programme in Cultural Studies from the perspectives of research, guidance and education. Her expertise would also enable strong cooperation in the preparation and implementation of future project applications. One of Turunen's key areas of expertise is a strong knowledge of European cultural heritage policy. She has examined, for example, the handling of the difficult past of colonialism in this context. Turunen also has a strong background in examining museums as social actors, as well as, more broadly, on the impact of memory of political issues and a so-called challenging past on the present day."

The Dean of the Philosophical Faculty decided (on 23 October 2024) to invite Professor Anna Sivula (University of Turku) and Professor Sanna Valkonen (University of Lapland) as experts to provide statements on the scientific qualification of PhD Johanna Turunen for the title of docent in Cultural Studies, in particular Critical Heritage Studies. Both experts are in favour of awarding the title of docent to Turunen.

A person to be awarded the title of docent is required to have good teaching skills (Universities Act 558/2009). For the purpose of assessing the teaching skills of PhD Johanna Turunen, the School of Humanities invited an evaluation team that met on 12 March 2025 to hear Turunen's trial lecture titled "Kulttuuriperinnön diskursiiviset merkityskamppailut: Akropolis". The Trial Lecture Committee graded Turunen's trial lecture as approved (good teaching skills).





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According to section 9 of the UEF University Regulations, the Faculty Council shall decide on awarding the title of docent.

The applicant meets the qualification requirements of a docent specified in section 89 of the Universities Act and the criteria set out in the docentship guidelines of the Philosophical Faculty for the title of docent.

Motion

The Faculty Council states that PhD Johanna Turunen meets the criteria set for the title of docent in the Universities Act and awards Turunen the title of docent in Cultural Studies, in particular Critical Heritage Studies at the University of Eastern Finland.

§ 12

The Dean's proposal on the person to be appointed to the post of University Lecturer, Early Childhood Education: Hearing of the Faculty Council

According to section 10(10) of the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland, the Dean shall, after hearing the Faculty Council, decide on persons to be appointed to permanent positions that comply with the four-stage career model (excluding professors, senior university lecturers and senior clinical lecturers).

According to section 9 of the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland, the Faculty Council will discuss proposals regarding the scope and specifications of the posts that comply with the four-stage career model of the faculty's permanent teaching and research staff and Tenure Track positions.

The post of University Lecturer, Early Childhood Education, is hosted by the School of Applied Educational Science and Teacher Education on the Joensuu campus. Persons to be appointed as University Lecturers must hold a suitable doctoral degree and have good teaching skills (University Regulations, section 31). In addition, good Finnish skills and the ability to teach in English, good practical familiarity with the field of the teaching duties (teaching and supervision experience in the field of early childhood education), as well as a documented track record of research in addition to doctoral dissertation work.





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The call for applications to the post ended on 21 March 2025. Nine applicants applied for the post by the deadline: MEd Çan Jasemin, DEd Hautakangas Merja, PhD Itäkare Susanna, DEd Kallio Heli, DEd Kuukka Anu, DEd Leskinen Jasmiina, DEd Peltopersä Kaisu, DEd Rawlings Anna and PhD Viinikka Kaisa. Merja Huhtakangas, Susanna Itäkare and Kaisu Peltoperi were invited to the interviews conducted on 8 and 14 April 2025, as they meet the requirements of a suitable doctoral degree, documented track record of post-doctoral research, good teaching skills, completed pedagogical studies (60 ECTS), good Finnish language skills and ability to teach in English, as well as good practical familiarity with the field of the teaching tasks (teaching and guidance experience in early childhood education).

Based on the teaching merit portfolio and interviews, the candidates invited to an interview have the good teaching skills required by the UEF University Regulations for the post of University Lecturer, Early Childhood Education.

Based on the interview and application documents, Susanna Itäkare meets the requirements laid down in the UEF University Regulations for the employment of a University Lecturer, Early Childhood Education, and the requirements for the post of a university lecturer. Susanna Itäkare has the language skills required for the post.

The School of Applied Educational Science and Teacher Education has proposed that Susanna Itäkare be appointed to the post of University





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Lecturer, Early childhood education, as from 1 August 2025 until further notice. A selection memorandum containing the School's proposal and its grounds are enclosed with this agenda item as an annex.

It is proposed that Kaisu Peltoperä be the second-choice candidate and Merja Hautakangas be the third-choice candidate should Itäkare not accept the offered post. The CVs, lists of publications and teaching portfolios of Itäkare, Peltoperä and Hautakangas are enclosed with this

A proposal to appoint DEd Virpi Turunen to the post of University Lecturer, Craft Science: Hearing of the Faculty Council
