Approving the study guide of the Philosophical Faculty for the academic year 2026–2027

According to section 9 of the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland, the Faculty Council will make decisions concerning curricula and degree requirements. According to section 18 of the Education Regulations, the faculties' curricula shall specify which degrees can be completed in the faculty and in which languages the degrees can be completed. The curriculum of the faculty shall contain the curricula of the degree programmes and the common regulations for all degree programmes. The curriculum of a degree programme must indicate the following: a plan for the guidance of major and minor subject students and the arrangement of guidance; the regulations concerning studies and degrees, such as the grounds for recognition of prior learning, the expiration of studies, the number of attempts to complete and repeat studies, the organisation of exams, and any transitional provisions.

Since the academic year 2019–2020, the University of Eastern Finland has used an electronic study guide that is available in Kamu (the current study guide). The guide includes matters jointly agreed within the university and, in particular, regulations concerning studies and degrees at the Philosophical Faculty that are decided by the Faculty Council. Following the reform of Kamu, the structure of the guide will change technically.

Approval of the consideration of the English-language matriculation examination in certificate-based admissions as from 2029

According to section 9 of the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland, the Faculty Council will make decisions concerning student admission criteria.

As from autumn 2028, the matriculation examination may be taken in Finnish, Swedish or English (Act on the Matriculation Examination 502/2019). The structure of the examination is the same in all languages. The English-language examination requires that the person has completed the Finnish as a second language (S2) or Swedish as a second language (R2) test. The test is determined by the language of instruction in upper secondary education. The English-language matriculation examinations implemented as translations, i.e., the content is the same in all languages.

Motion

In accordance with the Act on the Organisation of the Matriculation Examination (502/2019), English-language matriculation examinations will, as from 2029, be observed in the certificate-based admissions of universities in the same way as corresponding matriculation examinations completed in Finnish or Swedish.
