Removal of a course from the curriculum of the Department of Social Sciences for 2025–2028

The curriculum of the Department of Social Sciences for the academic years 2025–2028 was approved at the Faculty Council meeting of the Faculty of Social Sciences and Business Studies on 17 February 2025. At its meeting of 26 February 2026, the Faculty Council approved the amendments to the curricula that will take effect in the academic year 2026–2027.

Course YY00CZ08 The Nordic Model: Family, Work and Care (5 ECTS) is part of the thematic studies of the Bachelor of Social Sciences degree programme, taught in English, offered by the Department of Social Sciences. The course is also included in the studies offered to exchange students, as well as in the optional intermediate level courses of the Bachelor of Social Sciences degree.

The Department of Social Sciences has announced that, since the university lecturer responsible for the course recently left the University of Eastern Finland to work elsewhere, the course cannot be completed in any way during the academic years 2026–2028.

The removal of the course from the department's curriculum for 2025–2028 does not cause changes in the degree structure.

According to section 9 of the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland, the Faculty Council will make decisions concerning curricula and student admission criteria.

The Faculty Council of the Faculty of Social Sciences and Business Studies decided at its meeting of 22 January 2026 to transfer the Faculty Council's decision-making power in matters related to curricula. Based on the decision, the Vice Dean for Education can approve minor changes to the curriculum, but

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significant changes are always approved by the Faculty Council. Significant changes include the discontinuation of a course that was previously approved for the curriculum in such a way that it can no longer be completed in any way.

Motion The Faculty Council approves the removal of the course YY00CZ08 The Nordic Model: Family, Work and Care (5 ECTS) from the curriculum of the Department of Social Sciences for 2025–2028.

Description of the post of Professor, Criminal Law, and the Dean's proposal to invite Associate Professor Heikki Kallio to the post (Tenure Track): Hearing of the Faculty Council

According to section 33 of the Universities Act (558/2009), the professorship may be filled by invitation without a public notice of vacancy when an academically distinguished person is being invited to take the position or a candidate is appointed to the position for a fixed period. Only a person who indisputably fulfils the qualification requirements may be appointed to the post by invitation.

According to section 31 of the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland, a person to be appointed to a permanent professorship or to a professorship that lasts for over two years shall be scientifically or artistically qualified, have good teaching skills and, if important for the successful performance of their duties, practical knowledge of the scope of the post.

According to section 10 of the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland, the Dean will decide on the scope and specifications of the professor's position after consulting the Faculty Council. The Dean will decide whether the professor is required to have practical knowledge of the scope of the post. The Dean will make a proposal to the Rector on a person to be appointed as a professor for two years or more after consulting the Faculty Council.

LLD Heikki Kallio has been appointed to the Tenure Track position of Associate Professor, Criminal Law, for the period 1 December 2022 - 31 November 2026. The post is hosted by the faculty's Law School.

The members of the faculty's Appointments Committee, as referred to in Section 30 of the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland,

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are: Professor Seita Vesa (Chair), Professor Kaisa Huhta, Professor Mia Hoffrén, Professor Anssi Keinänen, Professor Emilia Korkea-aho, University Lecturer Kimmo Malin, Dean Matti Turtiainen, and, as secretaries, Executive Head of Administration Marko Junkkarinen and Senior HR Specialist Tuula Ranne.

Based on the submitted documents, the Appointments Committee came to the conclusion that the prerequisites to initiate the invitation procedure are met. The Appointments Committee supported the initiation of an evaluation process at its meeting of 22 June 2026.

The post of is intended to be filled by invitation as from 1 December 2026 or as agreed until further notice.

The description of the post includes the scope and specifications of the post required by the UEF University Regulations.

The professor is not expected to have practical knowledge of the scope of the post.

The description of the post has been reviewed with the person to be invited to it. According to section 9 of the University Regulations of the University of Eastern Finland, the Faculty Council will discuss proposals regarding the scope and specifications of the posts that comply with the four-stage career model of the faculty's permanent teaching and research staff and Tenure Track positions.

According to section 29 of the Universities Act (558/2009), a study attainment may be assessed only by those members or deputy members of a multi-member administrative body who have a degree or completed study attainments of an equivalent level or who have been appointed professors.
